Dear Members of the Rules and Administration Committee:

Thank you for re-arranging your schedules to arrive early in St. Petersburg for our meeting on Tuesday, March 13th beginning at 12:00 Noon. The only agenda item to discuss is setting the Special Order Calendar for the full Commission meetings starting Monday, March 19th. Attached is a proposed calendar order that reflects grouping the remaining proposals under the following criteria:

- Subject matter;
- Article of the Constitution; and
- Availability of the sponsor.

Many Commissioners have requested to group the remaining active proposals in subject-matter order so we can focus on similar issues at the same time. For example, with the current proposed calendar, we would take up education proposals together rather than taking up one education proposal at the beginning of the week and another at the end of the week.

I divided the proposals into 10 groups: 1) Public Employees; 2) Administration of Justice; 3) Legislature; 4) Public Ethics and Elections; 5) Health Care; 6) Government Organization; 7) Environment; 8) Religious, Economic, Property; 9) Education; and 10) Technical Revisions. Most of this matched up with the relevant Articles of the Constitution as well. Additional proposals may also be removed from committee and placed on the end of the Special Order Calendar pursuant to Rule 4.5.
