Public funding of education.-The education of children is a fundamental value of (a) the people of the State of Florida. It is, therefore, a paramount duty of the state to make adequate provision for the education of all children residing within its borders. This duty shall be fulfilled, at a minimum and not exclusively, through adequate Adequate provision shall be made by law for a uniform, efficient, safe, secure, and high quality system of free public schools that allows students to obtain a high quality education. Adequate provision shall also be made by law and for the establishment, maintenance, and operation of institutions of higher learning and other public education programs that the 23 24 needs of the people may require. 25 To assure that children attending public schools (b) 26 obtain a high quality education, the legislature shall make

adequate provision to ensure that, by the beginning of the 2010

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28 school year, there are a sufficient number of classrooms so 29 that:

30 (1) The maximum number of students who are assigned to 31 each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms for 32 prekindergarten through grade 3 does not exceed 18 students;

34 each teacher who is teaching in public school classrooms for
35 grades 4 through 8 does not exceed 22 students; and

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40 The class size requirements of this subsection do not apply to extracurricular classes. 49 <u>(c)(b)</u> Every four-year old child in Florida shall be 50 provided by the State a high quality pre-kindergarten learning 51 opportunity in the form of an early childhood development and 52 education program which shall be voluntary, high quality, free, 53 and delivered according to professionally accepted standards. An 54 early childhood development and education program means an 55 organized program designed to address and enhance each child's

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ability to make age appropriate progress in an appropriate range of settings in the development of language and cognitive capabilities and emotional, social, regulatory and moral capacities through education in basic skills and such other skills as the Legislature may determine to be appropriate.

61 (d) (d) (c) The early childhood education and development 62 programs provided by reason of subparagraph (c)(b) shall be 63 implemented no later than the beginning of the 2005 school year 64 through funds generated in addition to those used for existing education, health, and development programs. Existing education, 65 66 health, and development programs are those funded by the State as of January 1, 2002 that provided for child or adult 67 68 education, health care, or development.

Reverses legal precedent prohibiting public funding of 79 80 private school alternatives as part of the state's school choice 81 programs.
