That the following creation of Section 7 of Article VIII of the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose:

ARTICLE VIII

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

SECTION 7. SPECIAL DISTRICTS.--

- (a) The duration of a special district created after

 January 5, 2009, which is not accountable to the governing body
 of a county or municipality and which has authority to levy an
 ad valorem tax or assessment is limited to 11 years. Such
 special districts may be reauthorized by the voters for
 additional periods of 11 years or fewer as provided by law.
- (b) This section does not apply to special districts authorized by law to provide for the delivery of urban community development services. Such special districts must be created upon a petition approved through a process provided by law. In addition to other requirements specified by law, a petition must contain the written consent to the establishment of the district by all landowners whose real property is to be included in the

district, or documentation demonstrating that the petitioner has control of 100 percent of the real property to be included within the district by deed, trust agreement, contract, or option.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the following statement be placed on the ballot:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

ARTICLE VII, SECTION 7

REGULATION OF SPECIAL DISTRICTS HAVING AUTHORITY TO LEVY AN AD VALOREM TAX OR ASSESSMENT.—This amendment to the State Constitution limits the duration of special districts created after January 5, 2009, which are not accountable to the governing body of a county or municipality and which have authority to levy an ad valorem tax or assessment to 11 years. The special districts may be reauthorized by the voters for additional periods of 11 years or fewer as provided by law. This amendment does not apply to community development districts.
