Be It Resolved by the Taxation and Budget Reform Commission:

That the following creation of Section 8 of Article IX and a new section in Article XII of the State Constitution is agreed to and shall be submitted to the electors of this state for approval or rejection at the next general election or at an earlier special election specifically authorized by law for that purpose:

## ARTICLE IX EDUCATION

SECTION 8. REQUIRING SIXTY-FIVE PERCENT OF SCHOOL FUNDING FOR CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION. -- At least sixty-five percent of the school funding received by school districts shall be spent on classroom instruction, rather than on administration. Classroom instruction and administration shall be defined by law. The legislature may also address differences in administrative expenditures by district for necessary services, such as transportation and food services.

## CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

37 ARTICLE IX, SECTION 8

REQUIRING 65 PERCENT OF SCHOOL FUNDING FOR CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION.—This proposed amendment to the State Constitution generally requires that 65 percent of school funding received by school districts be spent on classroom instruction, rather than on administration.
