## INTRODUCTION

Intervenor, DADE COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, established the Dade County Medical Examiner's Office pursuant to Chapter 406 of the Florida Statutes. DADE COUNTY also owns and operates Jackson Memorial Hospital, which is affiliated with the University of Miami School of Medicine (Hospital Center).

On the campus of Jackson Memorial Hospital -University of Miami School of Medicine is the Florida Lions Eye Bank. The Eye Bank is located in the Department of Opthalmology of the University of Miami School of Medicine.

## STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

The number of people benefiting from corneal transplants has increased markedly in the last ten (10) years due to rapid scientific advances and "Medical Examiner" legislation.

In 1976, only five hundred (500) corneas were obtained in Florida for transplants. In 1984 alone, the Dade County Medical Examiner's Office supplied seven hundred twenty-nine (729) corneas to the Hospital Center, and the Broward County Medical Examiner's Office supplied six hundred four (604) corneas to the Hospital Center.

From January 1, 1985 through October 29, 1985, the Dade County Medical Examiner's Office has supplied six hundred two (602) corneas to the Hospital Center, and the Broward County Medical Examiner's Office has supplied two hundred ninety-eight (298) corneas to the Hospital Center.

As the foregoing indicates, corneas supplied by the Medical Examiners' Office in Dade and Broward Counties have been instrumental in restoring sight to the functionally blind citizens of Dade County and improving eyesight for others with impaired vision. (App. I) Without the availability of these donor tissues, two thousand three hundred thirty-three (2,333), who had been blind, could not have had their sight restored. This recovery of sight by citizens of Dade County is directly and solely attributable to the Medical Examiner's law.

In all other respects, DADE COUNTY joins, adopts and supports the Brief filed in this appeal by NORTH FLORIDA LIONS EYE BANK, INC., THE MEDICAL EYE BANK, INC. and FLORIDA LIONS EYE BANK, INC.
