Summary of Proceedings: Pursuant to the undersigned being duly appointed as referee to conduct disciplinary proceedings herein according to article XI of the Integration Rule of the Florida Bar and Rule 3-7.5 Rules of Discipline, a final hearing was held on October 31st, 1988. The enclosed pleadings, orders, transcripts and exhibits are forwarded to the Supreme Court of Florida with this report, and constitute the record in this case The following attorneys appeared as counsel for the parties: For The Florida Bar: John T. Berry & Thomas E. DeBerg For The Respondent: Donald T. Franke 11. Findings of Fact as to Each Item of Misconduct with Which the Respondent is Charged: After considering all the pleadings and evidence before me, I find the respondent has violated The Florida Bar Code of Professional Responsibility in the following cases: 1. On or about April 30,1987, respondent removed a swiss Army knife priced at approximately \$4.99 from the Sunshine Hardware Store located at 141-9th street North, Naples, Florida. Respondent didn't pay for the aforesaid knife and was not authorized to remove the knife from the premises without paying for it.
Respondent removed the aforesaid knife from the Sun-3. shine Hardware Store with the intent to permanently, or temporarily, appropriate the knife to his own use or to the use of another person not entitled thereto. In about April 1987, respondent used an illegal substance, to wit, cocaine.

In about April or May of 1988, respondent used an illegal substance, to wit, marijuana.

Respondent entered a treatment program for his drug addiction, but failed to complete the program.

Respondent admitted to illegal drug use after he left the drug treatment program and he has failed to avail 5. 6. the drug treatment program and he has failed to avail himself of the lawyers assistance substance abuse program of the Florida Bar, though it was made available to him. III. Recommendation as to Whether or Not the Respondent Should be Found Guilty, I find that the respondent be found guilty of the following violations of the Code of Professional Responsibility: That Bruce D. Franke has violated the following Disciplinary pules:
1. Committing a criminal act that reflects adversely on his honesty, trustworthiness, or fitness as a lawyer. Pule 4-8.4(b) Recommendation as to Disciplinary Measures to be Applied:

1. Suspension from the practice of law for a period of IV. ninety days (90) and enrollment and successful completion of the Florida Lawyers assistance for Substance Abuse Rehabilitation Program and demonstration to the satisfaction of the court that he is fully rehabilitated.

probationary period of 2 years for the respondent, following his rehabilitation and his return to the practice of law, conditioned on the respondent abstaining from the use of any illegal substances during the probationary period with the understanding that the respondent will be suspended for any probation violations.
