PER CURIAM.

We have for review *Morrow v. State*, 547 So.2d 1236 (Fla. 5th DCA 1989), in which the district court certified the following question to be of great public importance:

IS SECTION 893.13(1)(e),^[1] FLORIDA
STATUTES (1987) CONSTITUTIONAL?

Id. at 1237. We have jurisdiction. Art. V, § 3(b)(4), Fla.
Const.

In Burch v. State, No. 73,826 (Fla. Feb. 15, 1990), we
answered the certified question affirmatively. Therefore, we
approve the decision below.²

It is so ordered.

¹ Section 893.13(1)(e), Florida Statutes (1987), provides:
(e) Except as authorized by this chapter, it
is unlawful for any person to sell, purchase,
manufacture, or deliver, or to possess with the
intent to sell, purchase, manufacture, or deliver, a
controlled substance in, on, or within 1,000 feet of
the real property comprising a public or private
elementary, middle, or secondary school. Any person
who violates this paragraph with respect to:

1. A controlled substance named or described
in s. 893.03(1)(a), (1)(b), (1)(d), (2)(a), or
(2)(b) is guilty of a felony of the first degree,
punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or
s. 775.084.

2. A controlled substance named or described
in s. 893.03(1)(c), (2)(c), (3), or (4) is guilty of
a felony of the second degree, punishable as
provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.

² We decline to address the other issue sought to be raised here
which was not discussed in the district court opinion.
