PER CURIAM.

We originally accepted for review <u>Walker v. State</u>, 580 So.2d 281 (Fla. 4th DCA 1991), based on conflict jurisdiction.

<u>See</u> art. V, § 3(b)(3), Fla. Const. After further consideration, we have determined that jurisdiction was improvidently granted.

In <u>Walker</u> the Fourth District held that life felonies are <u>not</u> subject to enhancement under the habitual offender statute, section 775.084, Florida Statutes (1989). In 1986 the First

District had reached the opposite conclusion in <u>Watson v. State</u>, 504 So.2d 1267, 1270 (Fla. 1st DCA 1986), <u>review denied</u> 506 So.2d 1043 (Fla. 1987). However, in 1990, the First District held in <u>Johnson v. State</u>, 568 So.2d 519, 520 (Fla. 1st DCA 1990), that life felonies are <u>not</u> subject to the provisions of the habitual offender statute. This holding is consistent with the holding in <u>Walker</u>. Consequently, the cited decisions present no direct and express conflict as required by article V, section 3(b)(3) of the Florida Constitution. <u>See Little v. State</u>, 206 So.2d 9, 10 (Fla. 1968) (holding that in the result of intradistrict conflict, the decision later in time overrules the former as the decisional law in the district).

Accordingly, this Court is without jurisdiction to hear this cause and the case is hereby dismissed.

It is so ordered.
