OVERTON, J.

This is a petition to review <u>Thompson v. State</u>, 585 So. 2d 49% (Fla. 5th DCA 1991), in which the Fifth District, Court of Appeal held that Thompson cannot be sentenced for both the sale of a counterfeit controlled substance and for felony petit theft when both offenses are based on the same conduct. The district court certified the following question as one of great public importance: CAN A DEFENDANT BE PROPERLY CONVICTED OF BOTH FRAUDULENT SALE OF A COUNTERFEIT CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE AND FELONY PETIT THEFT WHERE BOTH CHARGES AROSE FROM THE SAME FRAUDULENT SALE?

Id. at 495. We have jurisdiction. Art. V, § 3(b)(4), Fla. Const. We answer the certified question in the negative and approve in full the district court decision, finding that it is consistent with our de'cision in <u>Houser v. State</u>, 474 So. 2d 1193 (Fla. 1985). We find that State v. <u>Bussey</u>, 463 so. 2d 1141 (Fla. 1985), is not applicable under the circumstances of this case and agree with the district court that this is a theft crime. We adopt the opinion of the district court as the opinion of this Court.

It is so ordered.
