PER CURIAM.

We have for review <u>McKnight v. State</u>, 23 Fla. L. Weekly D2402 (Fla. 1st DCA Oct. 23, 1998), a decision of the First District Court of Appeal certifying conflict with the decision of the Fifth District in <u>Maddox v. State</u>, 708 So. 2d 617 (Fla. 5th DCA 1998), <u>approved in part, disapproved in part</u>, 25 Fla. L. Weekly S367 (Fla. May 11, 2000). We have jurisdiction. <u>See</u> art. V, § 3(b)(4), Fla. Const.

McKnight received a ten-year habitual offender sentence for possession of cocaine. A habitual offender sentence for possession of cocaine is expressly

prohibited by statute and the sentence imposed exceeds the maximum non-habitual offender sentence permitted for the offense. <u>See McKnight</u>, 23 Fla. L. Weekly at

D2402. For the reasons expressed in our opinion in Maddox, we approve the decision

of the First District that this constitutes fundamental error correctable during the

window period discussed in Maddox.1

It is so ordered.
