As a practicing member of the Bar, the situation concerning law school graduates of Barry University concerns me. It would appear that the intent behind the current rules relating to bar admission are in place to ensure that the graduates taking the bar exam have graduated from a law school that has met certain standards. My understanding of the situation is that while Barry was undergoing the accreditation process, the rules were changed midstream. As a result, individuals graduating from Barry University's School of Law have not been permitted to obtain their results from the Florida Bar examination and practice their chosen profession.
