I am writing as an interested party on the above referenced matter. I request this honorable court amends Rules 2-11.1 and 4-13.2 of the Rules of the Supreme Court Relating to Admissions to the Bar. I have a very close friend who has been adversley affected by the current rules. In fact she attended Barry University and graduated in 2000, only to be forced to re-enroll and repeat her entire lawschool curiculium. As such, Iam writing to urge this court to implement a change in the rules, so that no one else in Florida will ever have to endure the hardship and heartache that has been endured by the individuals who have been adversley affected by these rules.

Typically, in most jurisdictions a law career begins once a law student graduates and passes the bar. I believe this honorable court has in the past adjusted the rules in the spirit of inclusion, not to exclude qualified candidates to practice law. The 12 month rule was created to include law graduates that otherwise were prevented to practice law. Once again this honorable court should change the rule to provide a positive and reasonable outcome and needed change for the future Florida graduates.

I urge this court to once again revamp the law to reflect the current ABA accreditation process, which allows for a 3 year window of different opportunities in which a law school is able to obtain provisional accreditation.
