My name is David Myers. I graduated from Barry University School of Law in June, 2000. After paying all necessary fees, I took the Florida Bar exam in February, 2001. I have been awaiting the release of my scores since that time. During my tenure of legal education I participated in law programs from Tulane University Law School and San Diego School of Law. I have studied under two United States Supreme Court justices and excelled in all my legal education.

I am in support of the above referenced petition. My support is based in a sincere belief that the justice system is fair and equitable. I could have held out one paper and delayed graduation but rather than manipulate the system, I graduated on time and put my life in the hands of a just system governed by reasonable people. After attending the American Bar Association conference in February of 2002 it has become abundantly clear that the accreditation process has been elongated. For the State of Florida to be in step with the ABA process, the above mentioned petition preserves the spirit of the rule.

I strongly urge the court to take action and grant relief. Release the Bar scores that have been held hostage for months, not just for the sake of fairness but for the sake of future graduates in additional Florida law schools now in their infancy.


