Good morning, Commissioners. The Rules and Administration Committee met on August 9th and gave recommendations on several deadlines for consideration by the full Commission. Following the cancellation of the commissioners' September 18th through 19th meetings due to Hurricane Irma, the rules committee met again on September 25th to revise the deadlines.

So much of the state clearly was impacted by the hurricane. Many people were recovering -- are still recovering, so basically the Commission -- or the Rules Committee thought it was appropriate to push back some of these deadlines to give Floridians more time and opportunity to participate. Clearly the public's input is critical to this process, and it was just the right thing to do.

So each of you commissioners have a copy of the report on your desk. The report recommends a public proposal submission deadline of October 6th. The old deadline was September 22nd. This is the proposed deadline for members of the public to submit constitutional amendments for you as commissioners to move to sponsor in accordance

with Rule 3.3.

The report also recommends a commissioner draft request deadline of October 17th. That is the deadline for commissioners to submit a request to have staff assist in drafting exact language of a proposals or maybe it's just a concept at that point. The key is, the deadline is October 17th if you would like staff to assist you in drafting your proposal. Any proposals submitted after the proposed deadline will be filed exactly as the commissioner submitted them without any technical or substantive revisions by staff.

Additionally, the report recommends a commissioner proposal filing deadline of October 31. This is the final deadline for commissioners to file a proposed constitutional amendment for consideration by the full Commission.

And finally, the report recommends a deadline for filing amendments to proposals being heard in a committee. The recommended amendment filing deadline is 24 hours before the notice hour of the meeting. And just to be clear, this recommendation only applies at the Committee level. It does not apply to amendments for full commission meetings.

Public participation is critical to the CRC process, and we are greatly to Floridians who have taken the time to submit proposals. We review

It is clear that Floridians share many of the same interests in similar subject areas.

Several commissioners observe the strong interest during the process of filing their own proposals based on the public input we have received. This is a collegial process that allows every commission the opportunity to identify good ideas put forward by Floridians that he or she would like to carry through this process.

Votes taken on these motions are to allow a commissioner to file the proposal. These are not votes on the substance of any individual proposal. We will consider each motion without debate and go directly to a vote. I ask commissioners to refrain from discussing the merits of any individual proposal.

Are there any motions to sponsor public proposals?

Commissioner Plymale is acknowledged.

MS. PLYMALE: I propose to sponsor 700396, which is titled "Closing the Write-in Loophole. It's sponsored by former Senator Dave Aronberg who's currently the State Attorney in West Palm Beach.
